The Goldman Sachs MBA Fellowship was established in 1997 and is an integral part of our diversity recruiting effort. The fellowship is designed to increase the level of interest in and awareness of careers in the financial services industry among Black, Hispanic and Native American business school students. The MBA Fellowship is a reflection of our Business Principles. It is awarded to recognize outstanding students and the achievements that they have made.

About the Fellowship

Recipients of the fellowship will receive:

- A summer internship in a US domestic office which will provide an opportunity to work as a summer associate between the first and second years of business school gaining insight into the financial services industry, our firm and our culture
- A \$15,000 award toward tuition, academic and living expenses
- Upon successful completion of the summer internship and acceptance of a full time offer, Goldman Sachs will also underwrite tuition costs associated with the second year of business school **or** an additional \$15,000 award toward tuition, academic and living expenses

Application Checklist

To be considered for the Goldman Sachs MBA Fellowship, you must submit the following information:

1. Complete a "Summer Associate" application at gs.com/careers with job code **MBAFellows10**. This job code should be entered in the "Positions preference" section of the online application

Note: Students at business schools where Goldman Sachs will be interviewing on-campus must apply by their school's deadline. Students from all other schools must apply by December 13, 2009.

2. Please write two essays (500 words maximum) in response to each of the following topics. You must upload your essays as part of your online application.
 - a. Explain your interest in pursuing a career in the financial services industry? Which division interests you most and why?
 - b. Community involvement and commitment are very important at Goldman Sachs. Please describe your recent involvement with a community-based organization.

All supplemental materials must be received by December 13, 2009.
