Impact Summary

In partnership with 833 nonprofit community partners worldwide, over 15,000 Goldman Sachs people joined with family and friends to contribute 79,951 hours to the communities where we work and live. Volunteers participated in 1,168 projects and assisted 170 infants, 21,703 children, 3,621 adolescents, 10,299 adults, 4,220 elderly, 13,515 persons with disabilities/special needs and 1,862 animals; painted 16 murals, 137 rooms and 49 community buildings; renovated and built 14 community buildings and 23 playgrounds; worked with Habitat for Humanity to build 20 new homes; beautified 11 beaches; planted 132 gardens, 3,535 trees and 29,677 flowers; served 14,924 meals; packaged 97,770 lbs. of food; delivered 15,750 meals and beautified 674 acres of land.
