Market Overview

Goldman Sachs Dynamic Opportunities Limited ("GSDO" or the "Fund") underlying investments ended the month of December in negative territory.

Only one of the nine managers in the Event Driven sector ended the month positively as equity and credit markets experienced mixed performance. In a reversal of previous months, several major global equity market indices generated positive returns with emerging markets rallying the most. In the corporate credit space, high yield bond indices were up approximately 5%, while leveraged loan indices were relatively flat. Despite this, several credit-oriented managers generated negative performance as losses from short index positions more than offset gains from long cash bond positions. In merger arbitrage, results were mixed as several managers profited from two deal closes in the financial sector, while some managers sustained losses from exposure to a deal in the chemicals/materials space. Managers continue to maintain low gross exposures going into 2009 as they remain concerned about the magnitude of the global recession and heightened levels of regulatory risk.

Three of the five managers in the Equity Long/Short sector ended the month positive. Managers experienced muted returns as they continued to manage with low levels of risk and did not participate in the market gains. December saw a decrease in equity market volatility, which combined with the managers' low risk levels led to a much smaller dispersion of manager returns than had been seen in previous months. Positive drivers of performance included net long exposure in consumer, healthcare, and technology positions. Primary detractors included short exposure in consumer discretionary/retail and financials stocks, as well as long exposure in energy and electric utilities positions.

During December 2008, all Tactical Trading managers were negative. Trend-following strategies generally profited from fixed income, particularly in the U.S., while the reversal of trends in equities and commodities hurt performance, as did short-term strategies. Macro managers posted positive performance early in the month, fuelled by fixed income positions, although the Euro's rebound detracted from performance.

The Investment Manager is pleased to announce that they have asked Kent Clark, Managing Director and Chairman of the Hedge Fund Strategies Investment Committee, to take on expanded responsibilities as the Chief Investment Officer and head of the investment teams focusing on the selection of hedge-fund managers ("Hedge Fund Strategies", or "HFS") and long-only managers. Peter Ort and Omar Asali, Managing Directors and co-heads of the HFS Investment Committee, have decided to leave the Investment Manager, each to pursue separate new opportunities.

Kent has over 16 years of investment experience at Goldman Sachs Asset Management. He has served on the HFS Investment Committee since 2000, and as CIO was responsible for the daily management of the investment team until 2007. At that time, he relinquished his HFS management responsibilities to lead the successful launch of a new business unit within GSAM. Kent will no longer have managerial duties for that group.

The Investment Manager is also pleased to announce that Eric Lane, Managing Director and Head of Alternative Investments & Capital Markets, and West Chapman, Managing Director and Head of Operational Due Diligence, will both be joining the HFS Investment Committee.

Substantially all of the Company's drawings under its credit facility, largely arising from losses incurred under the Company's foreign exchange hedging programme (which has since been suspended), have now been repaid from the proceeds of redemption of certain of the Company's investments. In anticipation of the making of required and/or voluntary redemption offers following the outcome of the shareholder meetings intended to be held in the first half of 2009 to consider continuation votes, the Company has submitted further redemption requests in respect of part or its complete investment with certain managers in the following sectors.

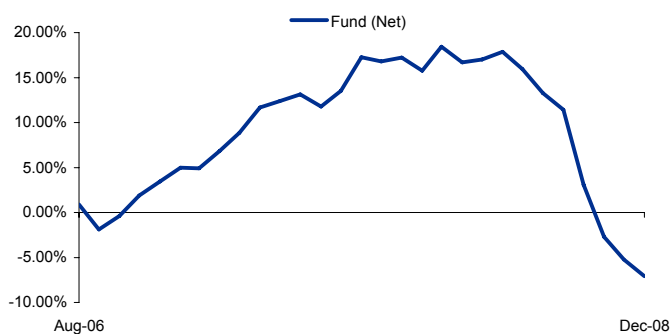

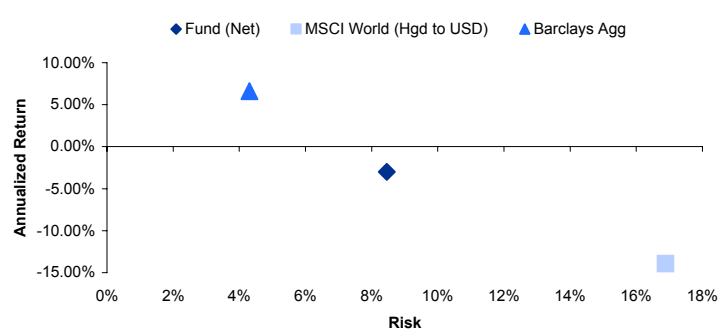

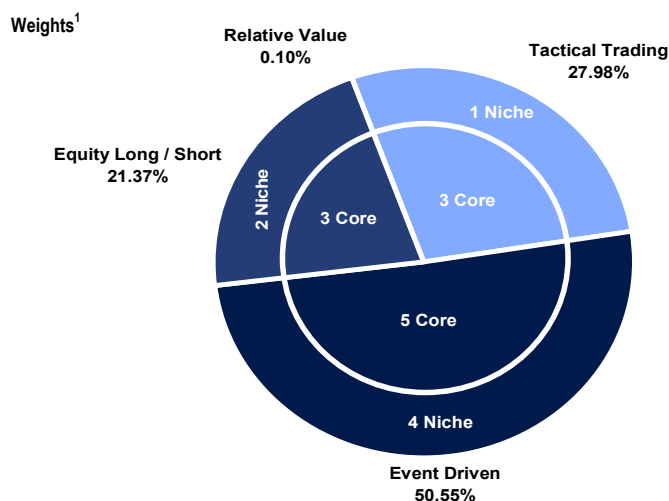

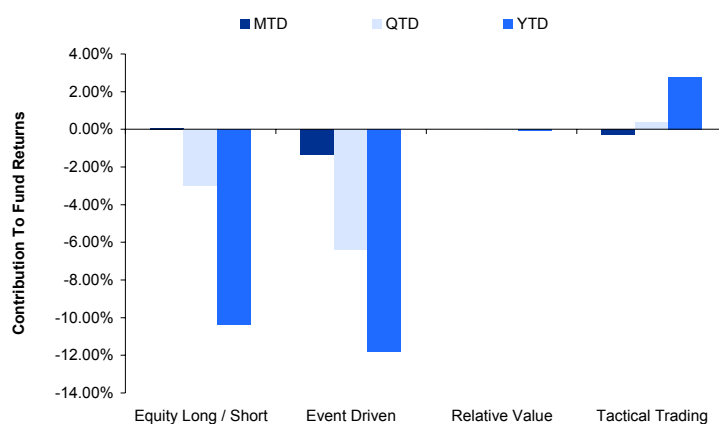

Effect of fees on performance:

The following table provides a simplified example of the effect of management and incentive fees on portfolio returns. For example, assume a portfolio has a steady investment return, gross of fees, of 0.5% per month and total management fees of 0.1250% per month of the market value of the portfolio on the last day of the month and incentive fees of 10% of net profits. Management fees and incentive fees are deducted from the market value of the portfolio on that day. There are no cash flows during the period. The table shows that, assuming that other factors such as investment return and fees remain constant, the difference increases due to the compounding effect over time. Of course, the magnitude of the difference between gross-of-fee and net-of-fee returns will depend on a variety of factors, and the example has been intentionally simplified.
