BRICs and Beyond: Building Businesses in Emerging Economies

In the seven years since the Goldman Sachs Economics team coined the term 'BRICs', Brazil, Russia, India and China have assumed a dramatically greater role in the world economy. From commodity markets to trade to global capital flows, the influence of the BRICs continues to grow. Goldman Sachs now estimates that China will be the world's largest economy in 20 years, and that the BRICs together will be larger than the G7 in 25. Goldman Sachs has now identified the Next-11, which are also set to experience rapid growth and which could rival the G7 in size over time.

In this session, you will hear from leading professionals who are building businesses in both the BRICs and Next-11 markets. Panelists will share their personal experiences, including how they have addressed challenges with urbanization, infrastructure, cultural differences, gender issues, political climate and general economic stability.
